IAN BECK

Ian Beck graduated from Brighton College of Art in 1968. He worked as a freelance illustrator for magazines before creating drawings for recording artists, most notably the cover of Elton John's 1973 album *Goodbye* Yellow Brick Road. His first illustrated books were published in the early 1980s and included several award-winning picture books. He has also written and illustrated his own books, including the Tom Trueheart series of novels which have been published in more than 20 languages.

BENEDICT BLATHWAYT

Benedict Blathwayt started his career as a painter before going on to publish more than 50 children's books, including the hugely successful *Little Red Train* series and *Bramble*. He won the Nestlé Smarties Book Prize in the six to eight years category for *Tangle and the Firesticks* in 1987.

RAYMOND BRIGGS

Raymond Briggs studied at Wimbledon School of Art and the Slade School of Art, London. He won the Kate Greenaway Medal twice, for *The Mother Goose Treasury* in 1966 and for *Father Christmas* in 1973. He has been described as "the poet laureate of British grumpiness" and is best known for *The Snowman* (1978) which was later turned into the iconic Christmas animation. He was awarded a CBE for services to literature in 2017.

ANTHONY BROWNE

Anthony Browne studied graphic design at Leeds College of Art and began his career as a medical artist. He has published more than 50 books and is the recipient of numerous awards, including the Kate Greenaway Medal (twice), the Kurt Maschler Award (three times) and in 2000, the Hans Christian Andersen Medal, an international award given to an illustrator in recognition of their body of work. His work has been widely exhibited all over the world and his books have been translated into over 25 languages. From 2009–11 he was the Children's Laureate.

LAUREN CHILD

Lauren Child studied art at Manchester Polytechnic and London Art School. She is the author and illustrator of the hugely popular *Clarice Bean* and *Charlie and Lola* books, among others. She has won the Kate Greenaway Medal and the Nestlé Smarties Book Prize (twice). In 2010 she was awarded an MBE for services to literature and was the Children's Laureate from 2017–19.

ERIC CARLE

Eric Carle was born in New York and educated in Germany, where he graduated from the prestigious Akademie der bildenden Künste in Stuttgart. After returning to New York he worked as a graphic designer and art director before illustrating and writing stories. He is the author and illustrator of more than 70 books, including the classic picture book *The Very Hungry Caterpillar*, which has been translated into 66 languages and sold over 50 million copies worldwide.

PETR HORÁČEK

Petr Horáček was born in Czechoslovakia and grew up on the outskirts of Prague. He studied design and painting at the Academy of Fine Art in Prague, graduating as a Master of Fine Art in 1994. In 1995 he moved to England and began to write and illustrate books soon after his first child was born. *Strawberries are Red* and *What is Black and White?* were published in 2001 and he received the Books For Children Newcomer Award in the same year. Since then Petr has written and illustrated many books for children, winning awards in the UK, the USA and The Netherlands. *Solitary* comes from the point where Petr's need for painting meets his need for illustrating books. Similar paintings are inspired by books or music.

SHIRLEY HUGHES

Shirley Hughes studied fashion and dress design at Liverpool Art School, before continuing her studies at the Ruskin School of Drawing and Fine Art in Oxford. Her first book, *Lucy and Tom's Day*, was published in 1960. She has won the Kate Greenaway Medal twice, for *Dogger* in 1977 and for *Ella's Big Chance* in 2003, the Other Award and the Eleanor Farjeon Award. Shirley was awarded an OBE in 1999 for services to children's literature and in 2017 became a CBE for services to literature.

ROBERT INGPEN

Robert Ingpen studied art and book illustration at The Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology (now RMIT University) and began his career as an illustrator and storyteller in 1968. In 1986 he became the only Australian to be awarded the international Hans Christian Andersen Medal for his contribution to children's literature as an illustrator. He has illustrated an acclaimed series of children's classics which continue to be published in many editions worldwide.

SIMON JAMES

As a child, Simon James gained a great affection for the cartoonists' books found on his father's shelves. They were to play a big influence in his approach to making picture books, leading Simon to consciously chose line-work to depict his ideas visually. Simon has published over twenty titles in many languages around the world. Titles such as *Dear Greenpeace*, *Sally and the Limpet* and *Baby Brains* have established him as a much-loved author/illustrator of children's books.

His latest book, *Mr* Scruff is a personal favourite. "The theme, the text and the illustrations encapsulate so much of what I enjoy seeing in a picture book," he says. "There's an economy of word, a lightness in the handling of the underlying theme and in the illustrations."

Oliver Jeffers grew up in Belfast. His practice encompasses painting, bookmaking, illustration, collage, performance and sculpture. His original artwork has been exhibited in prestigious institutions worldwide, including the Brooklyn Museum in New York, the Irish Museum of Modern Art in Dublin, the National Portrait Gallery in London and the Palais Auersperg in Vienna. He is the recipient of numerous awards, including a New York Times Best Illustrated Children's Books Award, the Bologna Ragazzi Award, an Irish Book Award and a UKLA Award.

Anita illustrated the much-loved classic *Guess How Much I Love You* written by Sam McBratney (Walker Books, 1994) which has sold over 50 million copies worldwide and been translated into over 50 languages.

John Lawrence is an illustrator and wood engraver who attended Hastings School of Art and the Central School of Arts and Crafts (now Central Saint Martins). He has illustrated more than 250 books, some of which he has also written. His work covers a wide range, from picture books for children to adult titles including the bestselling *Watership Down* by Richard Adams and Philip Pullman's *His Dark Materials* trilogy. His work is in several public collections including the V&A, the Ashmolean Museum and Manchester Metropolitan University.




DAVID MCKEE

JILL MURPHY

Jill Murphy attended Chelsea Art School and Croydon Art School. The success of her first book *The Worst Witch*, published when she was 24, paved the way for her long and successful career. She had further success with the *Large Family* books which have sold more than five million copies around the world. Jill's work has been awarded many prizes, including Commendations for the Kate Greenaway Medal, the 1987 Parents Magazine Best Books for Babies award and the Nestlé Smarties Book Prize. Jill Murphy died in 2021.

Helen Oxenbury is one of the best-loved and most widely-acclaimed illustrators of her time. The illustrator of more than 80 books for children which have together sold more than 35 million copies, she has been awarded the Kate Greenaway Medal, the Kurt Maschler Award and the Eric Carle Honor.


